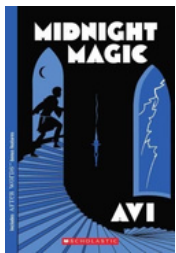
Escape from Mr. Lemoncello's Library

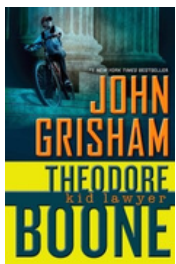
